What is the JTC about?

The Jamaica Teaching Council (JTC) is a response to the Task Force on Educational Reform Report (2004) outlining the vital role of teachers in increasing the achievement levels of children. The JTC was established in order to resolve issues and develop an effective and efficient teaching service responsive to the changing needs of society.



Our Objectives

- 1. To set and maintain professional standards-quality delivery of education fostered by competency, commitment and accountability
- 2. To improve the conditions of service of teachers and enhance the status of the profession
- 3. To review and advise the Minister of Education on critical policy directions
- 4. To ensure the efficient and effective management of JTC

- Establishing a code of ethics for the profession
- Establishing professional standards
- Monitoring and evaluating the performance
- Fostering accountability

- Establishing Teacher Resource Centres
- Establishing an online library
- Enabling peer support
- Advancing use of technology
- Enabling a 21st century teaching profession
- 3. Raise the public status of the teachers and teaching by:
- Recognizing excellence
- Promoting desirability of the profession
- Advocating for public support

What is the JTC doing now?

Completing the registration process:

- Serving teachers will be able to go online, enter their Tax Registration Number (TRN) and add and validate their personal information

Quality Education Circles

To reach all teachers, the JTC will work through Quality Education Circles.



Quality Education Circles (QEC) is an education community that is used as a strategy to facilitate progress in achievement. A QEC is geographically defined within parish borders. It will include all levels of education within the location and a Teacher Resource Centre (TRC) established within an existing institution with appropriate facilities. The TRC will be a repository for materials on the teaching profession

There will be approximately 60 throughout Jamaica.
